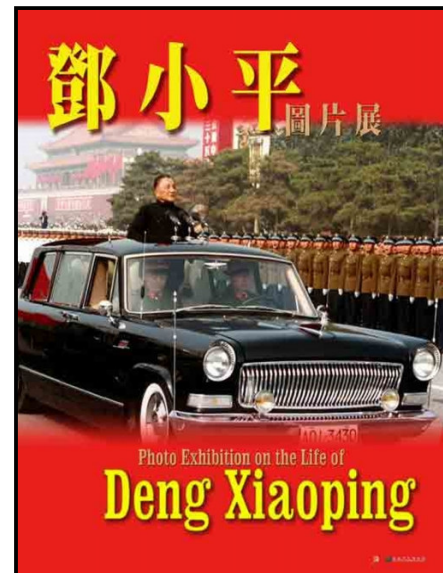
“Photo Exhibition on the Life of Deng Xiaoping”

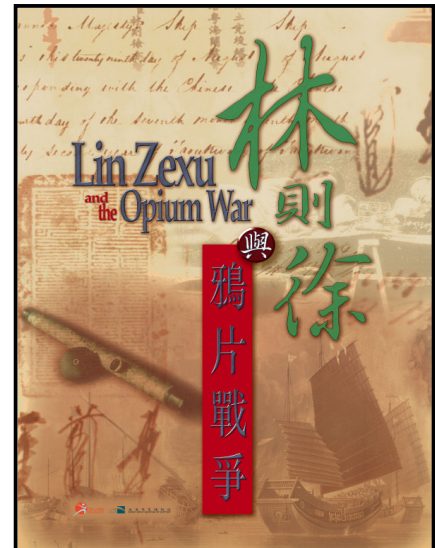
“Lin Zexu and the Opium War”
