## Reply:

Upon the advice of the Harbourfront Commission's Task Force on Harbourfront Developments in Kowloon, Tsuen Wan and Kwai Tsing, a public engagement exercise was launched between September and November 2015 to further engage the public and deepen the community's understanding of the Tsim Sha Tsui Waterfront Revitalisation Plan. Details are as follows –

(a) 6 focus group meetings were held at the Hong Kong Cultural Centre to gauge the views and aspirations of the community and key stakeholders on the proposed design –

- (b) A dedicated website was launched on 10 October 2015 to provide information on the design, details of the public engagement activities and channels for enquiries and submitting comments.
- (c) 4 roving exhibitions were mounted at various public places in Hong Kong. The exhibition included a video, a 3D model and information leaflet –

(d) A questionnaire survey was conducted from 26 October 2015 to 6 November 2015 at the locations of the roving exhibitions and a total of 2 127 completed questionnaires were received.
