What are the ratios of number of new parks and leisure facilities to population in the districts concerned? Does the Government have any plans to build new parks in 2016-17? If so, what are their locations, manpower arrangements and detailed expenditures?

<u>Reply</u>:

The Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD) manages parks, gardens, playgrounds and sitting-out areas to provide open space to meet both the active and passive recreational needs of the public. The 7 new parks built in the past 3 years in respective districts are set out at <u>Annex</u>.

In 2016-17, an open space project at Hing Wah Street West in Sham Shui Po is under construction. The approved estimate of the project is about \$122 million.

The current provision of open space (including parks) is sufficient to meet the Hong Kong Planning Standards and Guidelines at the territory-wide and district levels. In planning new facilities, the LCSD makes reference to not only the population ratio but also other factors such as the policy objectives for sports development, utilisation rates of existing facilities, demographic changes, the advice of District Councils and site availability.
