Question:

Please list in a table the locations and numbers of the gardens newly provided by the Government in the territory in the past three years as well as the respective expenditures on the cultivation and acquisition of vegetation. What are the ratios of the newly provided gardens to the population in their respective districts? Does the Government have any plans to provide new gardens in 2016-17? If so, what are the locations, manpower arrangements and details of expenditures involved?

Reply:

The Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD) manages parks, gardens, playgrounds and sitting-out areas to provide open space to meet both the active and passive recreational needs of the public. There were 9 new gardens and sitting-out areas in the past 3 years. The numbers of gardens in respective districts are set out at **Annex I**.

As the cultivation of vegetation and horticultural maintenance is an integral part of the management of the venues managed by the LCSD, breakdown figures on such work are not available.

The list of new gardens under development in 2016-17 is set out at **Annex II**.

The current provision of open space (including gardens and sitting-out areas) is sufficient to meet the Hong Kong Planning Standards and Guidelines at the territory-wide and district levels.
