Question:

Please set out in a table the following information about each of the swimming pools built in the territory in the past 3 years: the number and their locations; the manpower and expenditures involved; the numbers of main pools, secondary pools, training pools, teaching pools, diving pools, children's pools, toddlers' pools, family changing rooms, toilets, baby care rooms, changing rooms, facilities for persons with disabilities, heated pools and Jacuzzis; the expenditure items; and the ratio of number of new swimming pools to population in districts. Does the Government have any plans to build new swimming pools in 2016-17? If so, what are their locations, the swimming pool-to-population ratios, manpower arrangements and the relevant details, usage rates and expenditures involved?

Reply:

2 redeveloped swimming pools, namely Kwun Tong Swimming Pool and Victoria Park Swimming Pool, were completed in the past 3 years. Details on their facilities, attendance and operating expenditure are set out at **Annex**.

In 2016-17, the project "Sports Centre in Area 4, Tsing Yi", which includes an indoor heated swimming pool, is under construction. In addition, an indoor heated swimming pool is being planned as part of the composite project "Sports centre, community hall and football pitches in Area 1, Tai Po". Subject to the funding approval by the Finance Committee, the latter project can start in 2016-17. As the swimming pools are only part of the facilities to be provided in the 2 projects, no breakdown figures are available.

According to the Hong Kong Planning Standards and Guidelines, 1 swimming pool is provided for a district with population of 287 000 persons. The current provision of 43 public swimming pools is sufficient to meet the above standards and guidelines at the territory-wide and district levels. In planning new facilities, the Leisure and Cultural Services Department makes reference to not only the population but also other factors such

as the policy objectives for sports development, utilisation rates of existing facilities, demographics changes, the advice of District Councils and site availability.
