Reply:

- (a) The recruitment examinations for civil service lifeguards comprise selection interviews and trade tests to assess candidates' competencies or attributes. Trade tests are conducted to assess candidates' physical fitness, life-saving skills and first-aid skills. Candidates will also be tested orally on their knowledge of the Basic Law during recruitment interviews. For civil service senior lifeguards, the supervisory ability of candidates will also be tested. Medical examination including eye-sight test and colour blindness test will be carried out for successful candidates before appointment.
- (b) Details of recruitment exercises for civil service lifeguards (including senior lifeguards and lifeguards) in the past 6 years are set out at **Annex I**.
- (c) Details of the recruitment exercises for seasonal lifeguards in the past 6 years are set out at **Annex II**.
 - A comparison of the establishment, strength and vacancy rates of civil service lifeguards (including senior lifeguards and lifeguards), and the numbers and names of new public swimming pools/beaches in the past 3 years are set out at **Annex III**.
- (d) The training programmes for lifeguards are mainly conducted during the winter months (from November to March next year). 2 Training Assistants and about 15 instructors are responsible for conducting the training courses. The training expenses are around \$800,000 per year.
