Question:

Regarding the sports stadia managed by the Leisure and Cultural Services Department, please inform this Committee of:

- a) the proportions of usage of the sports stadia in each district for major sports events, variety shows, pop concerts and conferences in the past 3 years;
- b) the total numbers of tickets of concerts featuring local singers or groups held in the Hong Kong Coliseum in the past 3 years, the numbers of tickets on sale through the Urban Ticketing System and the percentages involved; and
- c) whether the Government has reviewed the terms and policies regarding the hire of the sports stadia in the districts, so as to curb ticket scalping activities.

Reply:

a) The proportion of usage of the Hong Kong Coliseum (HKC) and Queen Elizabeth Stadium (QES), the 2 multi-purpose indoor stadia under the management of the Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD), in the past 3 years are set out below –

c) According to the Terms and Conditions of Hire of the HKC and the QES, if a hirer organising paid-admission events chooses to use URBTIX for the sale of tickets, it has to ensure that at least a prescribed proportion of the tickets of each ticket price are available for open sale through URBTIX. To curb ticket scalping, the hirers may impose a limit on the number of tickets per transaction and the number of tickets for online transaction using the same credit card on the first day of ticket sale, so that more people may have the opportunity to purchase tickets through public sale. The Government will keep monitoring the situation closely and review the terms and conditions of hire when necessary.
