## Question:

Will the Government inform this Committee of the following:

- (1) What was the amount of refuse collected from beach cleaning operations each year in the past 3 years?
- (2) What was the expenditure for removing refuse from beaches each year in the past 3 years?
- (3) Regarding the incident in August 2017 wherein multiple beaches were polluted by a large quantity of palm stearin, what was the amount of palm stearin cleaned up? What were the manpower and expenditure involved in the cleanup?

## Reply:

(1) The Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD) manages 41 gazetted beaches. The amount of refuse collected within the gazetted beaches in the past 3 years is set out below –

- (2) As removal of refuse from beaches is part of the cleansing works carried out by cleansing workers at beaches, LCSD does not have separate breakdown on the expenditure for removing refuse from beaches in the past 3 years.
- (3) 13 gazetted beaches under LCSD's management were affected by the palm stearin spillage incident in August 2017. LCSD collected around 77 tonnes of palm stearin in the affected beaches. As the Marine Department is currently consulting with the Department of Justice on recovery of the cost incurred in the cleanup of the palm stearin involved by the Government, specific information could not be provided at this stage.
