Please provide, in detail, the following information for the past 5 years:

- How many newly commissioned pet gardens are there?
- In the 18 districts, how many licensed dogs are there? What is the number of pet gardens and their total area in each district?

In addition, of all the pet gardens across the territory, how many are provided with play equipment for dogs (please give details)? Take Butterfly Valley Road Pet Garden and Wan Po Road Pet Garden in Tseung Kwan O as examples, what are the costs of play equipment for dogs?

What is the number of management staff for each pet garden? How many times are the pet gardens cleaned per week on average?

Reply:

As at March 2018, 45 leisure venues under the management of the Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD) are provided with pet gardens. Of which, 12 pet gardens are provided with play equipment for pets. A list of existing venues provided with pet gardens is set out at <u>Annex</u>. Since play equipment for pets forms part of the facilities provided in Butterfly Valley Pet Garden and Tseung Kwan O Pet Garden, LCSD does not have separate breakdown figures on the cost of play equipment in these venues.

As the management of parks and playgrounds including pet gardens forms part of the work of the staff in districts, LCSD does not have breakdown figure on the manpower involved for each pet garden. Generally, the floor of most pet gardens is rinsed with water and the excreta collection bins are cleared at least twice a day. The Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD) does not have breakdown on the number of dog licences issued by different district constituencies. AFCD provides rabies inoculation and dog licensing services to the public through 4 Animal Management Centres (AMCs) and AFCD office in the Hong Kong International Airport (for imported dogs). The 4 AMCs are located in the New Territories North (NTN), New Territories South (NTS), Kowloon (K), and on Hong Kong Island (HK).
