What will be the estimate for the coming year?

The expenditure incurred by Leisure and Cultural Services Department in providing roadside potted plants was about \$2.3 million in 2010-11, and about \$2 million in both 2011-12 and 2012-13. The estimated expenditure for 2013-14 is about \$2.3 million.
