高甜心 (1915-?)

高甜心,江苏江都(今扬州)人。1915-?。幼承庭训,得其父高应三及叔友三治印真传。长期于南京和上海鬻艺,抗日战争时一度寓居桂林、成都等地。抗战胜利后返回上海,以治印为业。印作面目多样,秦汉玺印,皖浙诸派,无所不能。他以单刀刻款,以斜取势,起止分明,并因酷好吴昌硕篆书,得吴氏朴茂雄强之韵味。篆刻曾屡次作为礼品馈赠美国总统罗斯福等国外人士。

GAO Tianxin (1915–?)

Gao Tianxin (1915–?), a native of Jiangdu (present-day Yangzhou), Jiangsu, was deemed successful in learning seal carving from his father Gao Yingsan and his uncle Gao Yousan. Living on his art in Shanghai, he once moved to Guilin and Chengdu during the Sino-Japanese War. His seal carving shows an array of styles, including the Qin and Han seals, and the Zhe and Wan (Anhui) Schools of seal carving. His preference for Wu Changshuo's seal script is evident in his austere and robust rendering of the side inscriptions. His seals were often taken as gifts for foreign dignitaries like the President of the United States Franklin D. Roosevelt.
