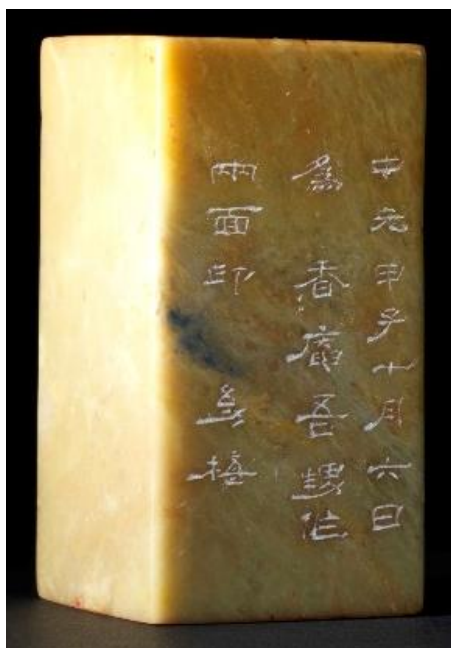
Seal carvers originated from, travelling to or living in Guangdong or Hong Kong

况仙根（活跃于清嘉庆、道光年间）

况仙根，广西桂林人。生年不确，约活动于清嘉庆、道光年间。初名桂本，以字行，号幼梅，自号味道人。况祥麟孙。廩生，官昭平训导。篆摹彝器款识，隶学《礼器碑》、《史晨碑》。精研刻印，尤擅长铁线、满白。

KUANG Xiangen (active between the Jiaqing and Daoguang reigns)

Kuang Xiangeng (dates unknown; active between the Jiaqing and Daoguang reigns), a native of Guilin, Guangxi, originally named Guiben, literary names Youmei and Weidaoren, was more widely known by his courtesy name. He was the grandson of prominent official-scholar Kuang Xianglin. He served as a “government student” receiving an allowance before he was appointed Assistant Instructor in Zhaoping, Guangxi. He derived inspiration from bronze inscriptions for his seal script and the *Stele of Ritual Vessels* and the *Stele for Shichen* for his clerical script. He was skilful at seal carving especially in the iron-wire and full-white styles.
