Reply:

- (a) Details of the projects funded in "Community-driven Projects" and "Partnership Projects" under the Intangible Cultural Heritage (ICH) Funding Scheme last year are at Annexes I and II respectively.
- (b) Under the staff establishment of the ICH Office, 3 members of staff are directly involved in supporting the ICH Funding Scheme. Their ranks, nature of work and salaries are set out as follows:

- (c) The ICH office plans to promulgate an updated version of the ICH inventory at the end of 2024.
- (d) Apart from covering the 20 items of high cultural value and with an urgent need for preservation on the Representative List of the ICH of Hong Kong, the ICH Funding Scheme also applies to the 480 items in the ICH Inventory of Hong Kong. The projects funded in the first 3 rounds of the ICH Funding Scheme involved a total of more than 140 items of the ICH Inventory. As at the end of 2022, the amount of grant provided under the ICH Funding Scheme was \$85 million.
