To beautify environment, the LCSD enhanced 21 roadside amenity areas from 1 June 2022 to 31 July 2022, including those flowerbeds at roundabouts and central medians, with colourful flowers to create festive atmosphere for the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Establishment of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region.



### Central



#### Floral Celebration in the Harbourfront (I)

Located at the roundabout of Pedder Street, this garden plot has the Ferris Wheel installation in the blue, purple and white season flowers field to create an atmosphere of the Victoria Harbour and evoke an ambience of prosperity.

#### Floral Celebration in the Harbourfront (II)

Located at the roundabout of Connaught Road Central, this garden plot is lavishly planted with blue, purple and white season flowers, with Victoria Harbour as its design theme, to create a visual effect of a blue sea. In addition, iconic Hong Kong installations such as the Star Ferry all make one feel close to home.



### Aberdeen



#### Celebrating the Return to Motherland in Festive Joy

With a great variety of brilliantly coloured flowers, this amenity plot along Wong Chuk Hang Road from Aberdeen Tunnel Exit perfectly conveys an ambience of prosperity and joy in festive celebration of the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishment of the HKSAR.







## Wan Chai



### Gathering and Marching Forward Together

Adjacent to the Wan Chai entrance of the Cross Harbour Tunnel, this garden plot features with puzzles as its design theme. Colourful flowers inside the puzzle pieces have signified the message of "marching forward in unison". In addition, there are two vintage cars with flower installations next to the plot, bringing a refreshing atmosphere to the vibrant and busy tunnel entrance.



## Chai Wan



### Sheer Enjoyment of Lush Greenery

Lush emerald vegetation is planted in the central median greening zone near the Chai Wan Road Roundabout Garden in creation of an amazingly joyful atmosphere.



## Tsim Sha Tsui



### Bauhinia in Blossom

Located at the junction of Chatham Road South and Granville Road in Tsim Sha Tsui, this flower bed is planted with refreshingly charming season flowers in creation of a pattern of Bauhinia, the city's flower, not only to beautify our city, but also to promote the image of Hong Kong.







## Sham Shui Po



### Festive Joy in Flowers of Colours

Located at the junction of Tai Po Road and Castle Peak Road in Sham Shui Po, this amenity plot is grown with variety of floriferous and lush plants, adding an atmosphere of great joy.



## Wong Tai Sin



### Flowers of Colours in Celebratory Mood

With colourful floriferous plants, this garden plot at the junction of Fung Mo Street and Lung Cheung Road in Wong Tai Sin, featuring rainbows as its design theme, creates an ambience of immense joy.

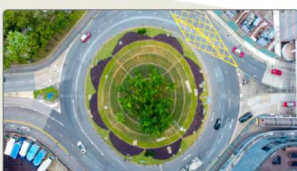


## Kwun Tong



### Embracing in Unison

Located at the roundabout of Wai Yip Street and Hoi Yuen Road, this garden plot features a layered circular design in manifestation of the well-defined cascaded hillside buildings in Kwun Tong District. The wavy shape of the plot is reminiscent of a harbourside setting. In the centre is lush palm greenery in a perfect match with surrounding flowers and foliage, signifying Hong Kong people's faith in "building the city in unison".







## Sha Tin



### Splendid Flowers in Celebration

Under the footbridge at the junction of Che Kung Miu Road and Hung Mui Kuk Road, this roundabout flower bed is planted with a variety of red, pink, golden and blue vegetation to create a distinctive landscape setting. Looking down from the footbridge, one will be greeted by a myriad of brilliantly attractive flowers in full bloom, which evoke an ambience of prosperity.



## Tai Po



### Blossoms around Town in Celebration

Located at Kwong Fuk Road Roundabout in Tai Po, this flower bed is lavishly planted with a variety of flowers to create a colourful landscape setting, with "Artti Kitty" and "Enggie Pup" on a boat trip to Lam Tsuen River and Tolo Harbour alongside little egrets, signifying that residents of varying cultural backgrounds enjoy living and working in Tai Po, and build a vibrant and heart-warming community, while marching ahead together in harmony.

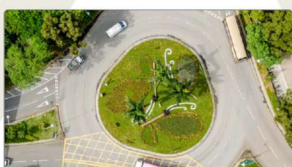


## Fanling



### Butterflies Fluttering in Emerald Greenery

Set at San Wan Road Roundabout in Fanling, this garden plot is adorned with multiple butterfly-shaped installations created by diversely coloured flowers and vegetation. The flower bed at the roundabout between Po Shun Road and Po Lam Road in Tseung Kwan O is planted with colourful plants to create a sense of happiness.

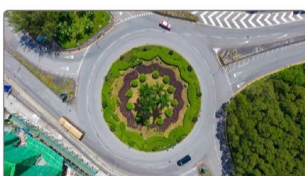


## Tsing Yi

## Tsuen Wan

This roadside flower bed is set at the junction of Castle Peak Road - Tsuen Wan and Kwan Mun Hau Street. Members of the public may enjoy the view of a sea of brilliantly coloured flowers, be they pedestrians walking along the footbridge or drivers passing by. The blooming flowers denote the success and prosperity of Hong Kong, while the flower bed running through all directions encapsulates the spirit of open and frank



## Kowloon City



### A Festive Sea of Flowers in Kowloon City

Set at Sheung Hing Street Roundabout in Kowloon City, this garden plot is planted with red, purple, blue, yellow and pink season flowers converging into a sea of flowers arranged in a windmill pattern, creating a festive atmosphere along the stretch of Princess Margaret Road and Pui Ching Road, which are always teeming with busy traffic.





## Flower Field Introduction

The six designated venues under the LCSD, namely the Central and Western District Promenade (Central Section), Kowloon Park, Lai Chi Kok Park, Tai Po Waterfront Park, Tat Tung Road Garden and Tuen Mun Cultural Square, were all adorned with colourful flower fields in celebration of the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishment of the HKSAR during the period between 13 June 2022 and 7 August 2022.

### Home Enlivened by Flowers

#### Central and Western District Promenade (Central Section)

The flower field features a combination of triangular flower plots of varying sizes, adding a sense of dimension to the design. Splendid flowers in brilliant hues attempt to outshine one another, symbolising the diversity and plurality of our city, in anticipation for an ever brighter future.



### Glitzy City in Celebratory Mood

#### Kowloon Park

The flower field is adorned, with such feature buildings including the Hong Kong Cultural Centre and the Clock Tower as its design theme, by a myriad of impressively coloured flowers to recreate the glamour of the landmark buildings in celebration of the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishment of the HKSAR.



### Warm Gatherings in a Sea of Flowers

#### Lai Chi Kok Park

Lavishly planted with season flowers in riotous colours, the flower field is a place for all to enjoy with fluttering butterflies amid flourishing blooms, where families and friends may relax and enjoy a blissful time together.

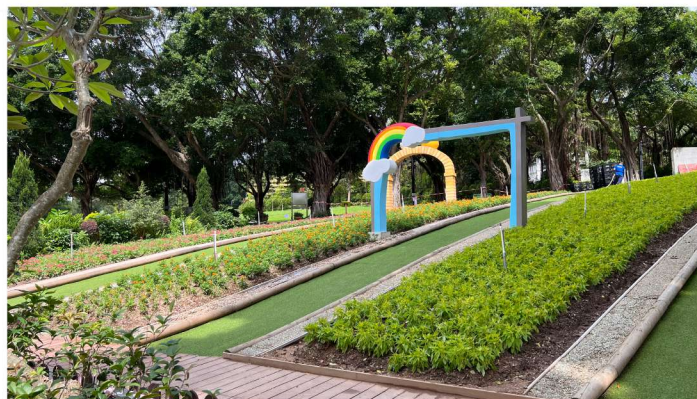




## Vibrant Fantasy of Floral Sea

### Tai Po Waterfront Park

The flower field occupies an area of about 2 500m<sup>2</sup>, it is the largest flower field in the scheme of "Blossom Around Town". Vibrant blooms in rainbow colours create an atmosphere of fantasy, perfectly blending with the Spiral Lookout Tower on the side. At the entrance stand "Enggie Pup" and "Artti Kitty", the mascots of the LCSD, while 3D frame is set up across the garden plot as check-in spots. Visitors may take photos to capture this joyful occasion, in celebration of the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Hong Kong's return to the motherland.



## Festive Joy in Flower Beauty

### Tuen Mun Cultural Square

The flower field features an installation in the shape of dolphins harmoniously blending with fountains. The splashing water, together with the impressively beautiful flower colours, are reminiscent of a scene in which dolphins happily swim amid a sea of flowers. Visitors may enjoy to the fullest extent this magnificent scene through circular viewing frames and take photos to capture this moment, in celebration of the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishment of the HKSAR.



## Flower Fragrance amid Mid-summer

### Tung Chung Tat Tung Road Garden

The flower field is festooned with glamorous blooms, in nice contrast to an ever-flowing stream of cable cars in vicinity, creating an atmosphere of festive joy. Vegetation of varying robustness is extensively grown in celebration of the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishment of the HKSAR.





## Flower Wall

### Flower Wall Introduction

The LCSD set up vertical flower walls at conspicuous locations in the Central and Western District Promenade (Central Section), Victoria Park, Kwun Tong Promenade and the Tsuen Wan Park, each with distinctive local features in designs, with a view to creating a festive ambience in the community and providing spots for photo-taking during the period between 13 June 2022 and 7 August 2022.



#### What a Glamorous Metropolis

##### Central and Western District Promenade (Central Section)

Hong Kong is internationally renowned for its top tourism assets. The flower wall features an installation modelled on the Peak Tram and the Ferris Wheel against a cityscape with emerald hills and skyscrapers in the background, creating a vital and buzzing ambience in demonstration of the impressive glamour of Hong Kong.



#### Full Blossoms in Mid-summer

##### Victoria Park

The flower wall features floriferous trees and such patterns as bees, butterflies and rainbows, with Bauhinia as its design theme, signifying that Hong Kong will, as in the past, further develop, thrive and prosper.





## Ascending to Success in Unison

### Kwun Tong Promenade

The transformation of Kwun Tong District from the past industrial area to the present commercial hub is testimony to the rise of Hong Kong. The design of the flower wall features carps swimming in waves, with “clouds drifting with waves” as its theme, signifying that Hong Kong will remain as vital as ever, while forging ahead with its development for a bright future.



## Heading Towards a New Era Beyond 25

### Tsuen Wan Park

Commissioned in 1998, Tin Kau Bridge was then the world's first three-tower cable-stayed bridge, marking a milestone in the development of the city. To celebrate the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Establishment of the HKSAR, the LCSD sets up a flower wall with this landmark infrastructure project and a rainbow as its theme, signifying that Hong Kong will become as magnificent as a rainbow and enter into another golden era.





The Jurassic Maze

The Jurassic Maze

The Jurassic Maze, located at the Kowloon Park Piazza was open to the public during the period between 13 June 2022 and 17 July 2022. With the theme of dinosaurs, the garden aimed to allow members of the public to enjoy the flower scene, while augmenting their knowledge of biodiversity in the prehistoric world via the activities at challenge stations and online games. They would be inspired to understand the principle of harmonious coexistence between humans and nature.



The garden occupied an area of about 900m<sup>2</sup>. Upon stepping into the maze, one would be greeted with lush foliage plants, watching the replicas of fossil specimens and dinosaur models in an interesting and rewarding quest for knowledge. In the centre of the maze stood a flower box created in the shape of number 25, in celebration of the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishment of the HKSAR.





## Birthday Theme Display

### Happy Birthday, Hong Kong!

Located in Sha Tin Park during the period between 13 June 2022 and 7 August 2022, this plot featured a giant birthday cake in flowers and candies to evoke an ambience of joy among members of the public, in celebration of the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishment of the HKSAR. In addition, two big building blocks "Enggie Pup" and "Artti Kitty", the LCSD's lovely and energetic mascots, could be seen in the plot. All were welcome to take pictures with them and celebrate Hong Kong's "Happy Birthday".





Garden Plots commenced from 9 September 2022 to 16 October 2022 in 18 districts for public appreciation. The public could take photos and checked-in at the distinctive garden plots at designated parks, and casted online vote for their favourite garden plots with a chance to win fabulous gifts.

## Oriental Style Garden Plot



### Eastern - Quarry Bay Park (Phase I)

#### A Relaxing, Tranquil Space

Inspired by Bali, this garden is designed in such a manner to perfectly integrate its spaces with the surroundings, exuding a Southeast Asian ambience. Strolling along the stone walkway, one sees the timber beams supporting the pavilion roof, with a light enhancing design that allows natural light to reach every part of the space. The crisscrossing beams are carefully spaced out, adding depth to the space, while relieving the sense of density. The open courtyard design breaks down the boundary between inside and outside, allowing visitors to enjoy outdoor environments to the fullest. Thanks to the gurgle of water from the water feature, lush tropical plants, soft coloured flowers and modern sculptural decorations, the garden brims with life. We hope visitors will find the garden comfortable and tranquil to take a rest in a moment of peace and relaxation.



### Kowloon City - Kowloon Tsai Park

#### Flowers in Bloom - Resonance

Flowers are in full bloom with green willows in the verdant garden, brimming with life amid the gurgle of water: The musician plays music to celebrate the return of relatives and friends from far afield. Joy fills the air as all are enjoying their reunion amid the charming blossom. The garden plot is designed in a classical Jiangnan gardening style. A great nature admirer, the musician builds the garden by employing a combination of rockery and water features, exotic flowers and plants, winding walkways, as well as a cloister and half-pavilion, depicting the magnificence and splendor of a picturesque scene. The green concept of rain gardens is incorporated into the design. The musician decorates the pond with a stone pillar, while creating musical instruments with waste wood and bamboo materials, embodying the lofty convergence with nature.



### Kwai Tsing - Tsing Yi Promenade

#### Together in the House and Garden of Joy

Based on Thai gardens, the design of this garden plot adopts a meticulous layout, together with carefully selected decorations, giving prominence to the designer's ingenuity. The owner and his family work together to build a nice home. In celebrating seasonal festivals, the family gathers together to admire flowers, reminisce about the good days of yore and exchange blessings, with the garden overflowing with warmth and laughter. The garden plot features quaint decorations and furnishings made of natural materials, together with the delightfully coloured flowers and tropical plants around, adding to the harmonious beauty of nature. On a stroll along the winding walkway, one is greeted by the pond of pebbles and balcony, followed by the Thai gazebo, in admiration of the undulating garden landscape. Listening to water trickling into the pond, one loses sense of existence in lofty convergence with nature, inducing a state of calmness in mind.







### Kwun Tong - Jordan Valley Park

#### Caves and Woods · Togetherness

Designed with the theme of Suzhou's classical gardens, this garden plot consists of well-placed rockery and water features, together with lush plants and flowers, epitomising the essence of "oneness" which means convergence with nature. There is also a pavilion for sitting out, allowing one to empty thoughts and worries. On a stroll along the pebbled footpath, one ponders the philosophy embedded in each and every piece of pebble and rock, thereby cleansing minds of confusion. In this small garden of abundant natural beauty, one takes a brief respite from daily routines, while embracing the future with hope and smiles.



### Southern - Repulse Bay Gardens

#### Overjoyed

Inspired by holiday resorts in Southeast Asia, the garden plot is designed for visitors to escape from the hustle and bustle, beat the blues and cleanse the soul, as if going on a relaxing vacation.

The garden plot features a healing garden for visitors to meditate and relax bodies and minds, in the hope of allowing them to be inspired through contemplation and re-energised amid peace and tranquility.

Plants of soft and complementary colours are grown in groups based on natural forms for a balanced yet dynamic composition, thereby creating a joyful and harmonious environment. In addition, the landscaping design incorporates elements of sustainability by introducing a variety of plants to enrich diversity, as well as maximising use of recyclable materials to reduce wastage.



### Tai Po - Tai Po Waterfront Park

#### Autumn Festival and Moon Appreciation

Let's celebrate autumn harvest against the backdrop of a red bridge lit by moonlight.

Walking into this garden, one may take a leisurely stroll along the cobbled stone path and appreciate the blooming osmanthus fragrans around amid a strong scent. In addition, the dainty Calibrachoa is swaying in wind, leaving an impressive fragrance. Looking further afield, one will be greeted by spotted butterflies fluttering in woods, and mesmerised by a pair of cuddling crane couple.

The garden is festooned with traditional lanterns, while Japanese style stalls are selling festive souvenirs outside. It is ever more poetically romantic to visit the garden during the autumn festival under the bright moon in the sky.

With flowers in bloom amid an autumn breeze, we should enjoy a stroll to the garden, admiring the riotous blooms during a moon night in pursuit of great bliss.







## Tuen Mun - Yeung Siu Hang Garden

### Long Vacation

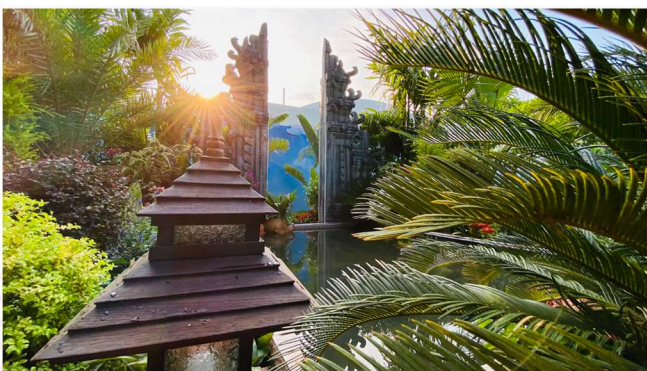

## Yuen Long - Yuen Long Park

### Prism in the Water

Inspired by the "Gate to Heaven" at the Pura Lempuyang Luhur in Bali, Indonesia, this garden plot is designed in such a manner that one gazes in delight at the coloured clouds and scenic views around, all mirrored by the unmoving pond. With the landscape full of Southeast Asian features, the garden creates a tranquil and relaxing space to cleanse the soul, washing away worries. The idyllic pond is adorned with natural sandstone sculptures. Lavishly planted with equatorial plants interspersed with the riotously coloured flowers, the garden exudes an intensely tropical atmosphere reminiscent of the Indonesian island. One admires the stunning landscape from multiple angles, while experiencing the unusual visual enjoyment brought by the "Prism in the Water".

## Sham Shui Po - Fa Hui Park

### Wish Upon a Star

This is a garden of stars where we can achieve synergy. All life born into the world is precious, and each shines brightly like the stars in the sky. With the botanical world teeming with life and the nature in quietness and harmony, let us appreciate the stars that light up our lives and move towards our wishes of peace and integration in unity.

The main part of this garden plot consists of two circular flowerbeds, one large and one small, connected by a walkway. The larger flowerbed is covered with a myriad of many-coloured plants symbolising the profound joy and the ceaseless flow of vitality in our lives, while the smaller flowerbed features an iron ball art installation and a star lighting setup embodying the wishes made upon the stars by visitors. ## Tsuen Wan - Jockey Club Tak Wah Park
