



- In 2019, **947** tonnes of waste were collected
- of which **755** tonnes were recyclables/ reusables
- The recovery rate was close to **80** %







Waste reduction at source

- A total of 947 tonnes of waste were collected in this year's Show, which was **44 tonnes** fewer than the 991 tonnes last year (↓ 4.4%).





“plastic- and disposable-free”

- Over **53 000** reusable tableware items were lent out.
- There was a **50%** reduction in the amount of recovered waste plastic compared with last year (510 kg  250 kg).







Utilisation of waste

- Waste wood from trees damaged by super typhoon Mangkhut was used as raw material, and **48** tonnes of reusable wood were collected through the “Wood Collection Point” set up in the showground.








Recycled Materials





- Attendance: over 630 000



- Among the exhibits were landscaped gardens, floral displays, potted plants and Bonsai.








- Electronic communication channels were used as far as possible.

Environmental Protection and Waste Reduction Measures

- Exhibitors were reminded to duly clear up exhibits and recycle reusable materials.
- Terms requiring contractors to recycle reusable materials were included in tender.
- Fast food stalls were asked not to give out disposable straws and to refrain from providing disposable plastic tableware.

Before the Show

Students and volunteers were recruited and trained for recycling tasks. “Temporary Waste Collection Points” and “Recyclables Collection Points” were set up during venue decoration to collect materials for recycling.

Three-coloured waste separation bins and clean recycling bins were provided.



"Recyclables Collection Points" were set up and food waste bins were provided.

- Show green ambassadors were deployed to guide visitors in waste separation and recycling.

- The “Green Food Stall” award was introduced to encourage fast food stalls to support the “plastic-free” campaign.

No bottled water was provided and visitors were encouraged to bring their own bottle.


Noise monitoring stations were set up in the showground.
