- 1. Objective: To offer former participants of the Easy Sport Programme Baseball under the School Sports Programme (SSP) an opportunity for exchanges to develop their interests in Baseball and enhance their skills and gain experience in competitions.
- Eligibility: The Competition is open to primary schools which participated in the Easy Sport
 Programme Baseball between <u>1 September 2024 and 31 December 2025</u>.
 Remaining quota will be allocated to other elementary/primary school students
 who have participated in training courses or programmes approved by the relevant
 Sports Association.

3. Time and Venue:

4. Quota:

- a. 8 Teams (Each team is composed of 8 to 12 members. Mixed teams of boys and girls are allowed.)
- b. For efficient use of the resources, the Organiser may adjust the quota in the light of application response. The quota will be finalised on the ballot date. Participating schools/participants shall raise no objection.

5. Notes on application:

- a. Priority will be accorded to schools which participated in the Easy Sport Programme Baseball between 1 September 2024 and 31 December 2025. If oversubscribed, places will be determined by ballot. Each school may enrol a maximum of 2 teams. Please indicate their priority on the application form (i.e., "Team 1" and "Team 2"). Should any places remain after the first round of ballot, teams with lower priority may be considered. Any places still remaining after that will be allocated by ballot to schools that have not previously participated in the Easy Sport Programme —Baseball.
- b. Each player may only be in one team and should be a current student of the school represented by the team during the Competition.
- c. Please submit completed application forms by email (email address: almiissp2@lcsd.gov.hk) or by post to this Office.

- d. A list of successful applicants and payment details will be sent to the schools concerned by post.
- e. The list of participants is not subject to change after payment has been completed.
- 6. Fee: \$320 per team
- 7. Application Submission Period:

23/10/2025 to 13/11/2025 (The postmark or email date will be deemed the date of submission.)

8. Place Allocation Ballot:

The ballot will be held at 1/F Lobby, Leisure and Cultural Services Headquarters at 4:00 pm on 17 November 2025. School representatives are welcome to attend. Successful schools will be notified in writing, while unsuccessful schools will not be contacted further. The ballot result will be posted on the following website on 18 November 2025:

- 11. Fixture Draw and Team Managers' Meeting:

The fixture draw will be held at 1/F Lobby, Leisure and Cultural Services Headquarters at 4:00 pm on 18 December 2025. A team managers' meeting will also be held at the same time to explain the rules and other details of the competition. Schools are requested to send their team manager or representative to attend. Participating schools will be notified of the draw results and reporting time in writing. The same information will also be posted on the LCSD's website on 22 December 2025:

12. Format:

- a. A single round-robin system on a group basis will be adopted, subject to the actual number of entries.
- h. The rules and regulations of *Baseball SIX* will be adopted.
- c. Each game lasts for 30 minutes, and no new innings will be started after 30 minutes. All runs scored will be counted. Two completed innings will be considered a regulation game, with a maximum of five innings.
- d. Mercy Rule:
 - i. A game is over if a team trails by 10 or more runs after having batted at least in 2 innings; or
 - ii. 7 or more runs after having batted at least in 3 innings; or

iii. 5 or more runs after having batted at least in 4 innings.

If the score is tied at the end of regulation time, the game will go into extra innings. The offensive team's next three batters due up in the batting order will bat.

e. Batting Limit:

Each offensive inning consists of 6 batters. The three-out rule does not apply. The inning ends and sides switch only after the 6th batter's at-bat is complete AND the defensive team has secured the ball inside the home plate defensive area.

- f. Unless otherwise stipulated in this Prospectus, the existing rules of the Baseball Association of Hong Kong, China (BAHKC) shall apply.
- g. The Organiser reserves the right to change the competition format as necessary.

13. Registration:

- a. Participating teams must report to the Organiser with their line-up card 30 minutes before the start of the game. Those who fail to show up within five minutes of being called by the Organiser will result in a forfeit.
- b. Members of participating team must present <u>a valid photo-bearing identification</u> <u>document</u> (e.g. student handbook, student card) for verification before the competition.
- c. The competition schedule shall be as announced on-site.

14. Inclement Weather Arrangements

- a. All matches will be cancelled if the Education Bureau announces school suspension or if Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal No. 3 or above, or Amber Rainstorm Warning Signal or above remains in force two hours before the reporting time for the first round of matches on the competition day. Participants will be notified of alternative arrangements in due course. Under other weather conditions, all participants are required to report to the Organiser on time. The referee on site will decide whether matches proceed as scheduled.
- b. If the Environmental Protection Department announces that the Air Quality Health Index recorded by general stations in the area reaches 10+ ("Serious" health risk category), all ongoing matches will be **suspended immediately**.

15. Remarks:

- a. Schools should remind their students to bring along their lunch and sufficient drinks.
- b. All teams shall prepare two sets of sportswear in different colours (one in dark colour and the other in light colour). Team members shall wear proper sportswear and shoes with non-marking rubber outsoles during the Competition.
- c. All participants shall not wear metal spike shoes and metal jewellery during the matches.
- d. The Organiser would provide Fun Safety Balls, bases and Rolling Tee set next to the home plate. Balls shall be put onto the Rolling Tee by the offenders or their coach. The

- teams can bring their own Tee Bat or borrow from the Organiser on the event day if needed.
- e. Fielders may catch the ball with bare hands or with gloves, catching with caps is not permitted.
- f. The distances of the demarcation are shown as follow:
 - between bases: 60 feet;
 - between the pitcher's plate and home plate: 35 feet;
 - between home plate and outfield fence: 104 feet.
- g. Participating teams which play in consecutive matches may take a break of 5 to 10 minutes between each match. The Organiser reserves the right to make arrangements according to actual circumstances. Participating teams shall not request postponement of matches on the grounds of fatigue.
- h. Any team leaving the playing area during a match shall be deemed to have forfeited the match. The opposing team shall be declared the winner by the Organiser.
- i. In case of a breach of the rules or regulations of the Competition or unsporting behaviour by a team leader or team member, the referee shall have the right to disqualify the team from the Competition.
- j. The Organiser will carry out photo shoots/video-filming/arrange broadcasting during the competition, and has the right to display/publish the event photos or videos on the Internet, at venues of the Leisure and Cultural Services Department, on the dedicated website, in publications of the Organiser and through other publicity channels, for promotion of activities or record purposes.

16. Awards:

- a. Each team member will receive a commemorative certificate.
- b. The 'Most Valuable Player' (MVP) will be chosen <u>from each team</u> according to the players' performance on the event day by their coach. A certificate of merit issued by the BAHKC will be presented to the MVPs.
- c. Trophies will be awarded to the champion, first, second and third runners-up and four merit award winners (The actual number of awards is subject to the number of participating team). Medals and certificates will also be awarded to members of the winning teams. The prizes will be presented to the winners on the spot after the finals are completed.
- d. For participating teams which fail to show up for or complete any event, the Organiser has the right to revoke their eligibility for prizes and no trophies, medals or certificates will be given to them.

17. Appeal:

No appeal will be accepted. The referees' decision on the competition results shall be final.
