2026 Easy Sport Competition — Mini-squash
【Prospectus】

1. Objective : To offer former participants of the Easy Sport Programme — Squash under the School Sports Programme (SSP) an opportunity for exchanges to develop their interest in squash, enhance their skills and gain experience in competitions.
2. Eligibility : The Competition is open to primary schools which participated in the Easy Sport Programme - Squash between 1 September 2024 and 31 December 2025.

5. Notes on application :

- a. Each student may only represent one school and should be a current student of the school during the Competition.
- b. Participants may only enrol in the division appropriate to their age.
- c. Each school may enrol a maximum of 6 students in each division (please refer to the quota of each game). Please indicate their priority on the application form.
- d. For efficient use of the resources, the Organiser may adjust the quota for each division in the light of application response. The quota of each division will be finalised on the ballot date. Participating schools/ participants shall raise no objection.
- e. Places in each division will be evenly allocated to schools in the first round of processing. The remaining places that cannot be evenly distributed will be allocated by ballot.
- f. Please submit completed application forms by Email, post or by fax (Email address: applicationssp@lcsd.gov.hk; fax no.: 2684 9076, 2697 5087) to this Office.
- g. A list of successful applicants and payment details will be sent to the schools concerned by fax.
- h. The list of participants is not subject to change after payment has been completed.

6. Fee : \$35 per person (The fee covers both the preliminary and final competitions.)

7. Deadline for Application :

27 February 2026 (Friday) (The postmark or Email date will be deemed the date of submission.)

8. Enrolment ballot :

The ballot will be held at the Leisure and Cultural Services Headquarters (Rm 201) at 11 am on 4 March 2026. Representatives of schools are welcome to attend. School allocated with places will be informed by fax, while unsuccessful ones will not be notified. The ballot result will be posted on the following website on 9 March 2026:

10. Payment period for successful waiting list applicants : 27 March 2026 to 2 April 2026

11. Match Draw :

The match draw will be held at the Leisure and Cultural Services Headquarters (Rm 202) at 11 am on 15 April 2026. Visitors are welcome. Letters will be sent to participating schools informing them of the results of the draw and reporting time. The relevant information will also be uploaded on the LCSD's web page on 22 April 2026:

12. Format :

- a. This will be a single elimination competition. Winners of the preliminary round will proceed to the final round.
- b. All matches will be played to the best of 3 sets. The first team to reach 9 points wins in a set.
- c. The Competition will be held in standard squash courts where the short lines will be moved towards the front wall by **1 metre** for Group A and **1.5 metres** for Group B respectively.
- d. Pink and green mini-squash balls will be used in Group A and B respectively.
- e. Participants may serve anywhere inside the own back half of the court but not necessarily inside the service box.
- f. Unless otherwise stipulated in this prospectus, the existing rules employed by the Squash Association of Hong Kong, China will be adopted.
- g. The Organiser has the right to change the format as necessary.

13. Reporting on Arrival :

- a. Participants shall report to the staff of the Organiser 15 minutes before the scheduled time of the match. Those who fail to show up within 5 minutes after the staff of the Organiser's roll call will be deemed to have waived their right to participate.
- b. Participants shall produce unambiguous proof of identity bearing photos, e.g. student handbooks, student cards, etc. to the staff of the Organiser on the competition day for verification.
- c. The competition schedule shall be as announced on-site.

14. Inclement Weather and Unexpected Incidents Arrangements :

- a. In case the Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal No. 8 or above, or Rainstorm Signal Red/ Black is issued by the Hong Kong Observatory two hours before the reporting time for the first round of events on the competition day; or the Environmental Protection Department has announced that the Air Quality Health Index (AQHI) recorded at its general monitoring stations reaches 10+ ("Serious" health risk category) in the competition area; or the Education Bureau has

announced the closure of schools; or unexpected incidents happened, all events on the day will be cancelled. Participants will be notified of the corresponding arrangements. Under other weather conditions, all participants are required to report to the Organiser as scheduled. The referees on the site shall decide whether the Competition should proceed or not.

- b. If the AQHI recorded at the general monitoring stations in the competition area reaches 10+ (“Serious” health risk category) during the Competition, all events in progress shall be **terminated immediately**.

15. Remarks :

- a. Participants shall wear proper sportswear and shoes with non-marking rubber outsoles during the Competition.
- b. Participants shall bring their own mini-squash rackets. According to the suggestion of the Squash Association of Hong Kong, China, the length of a racket shall not exceed 63.5cm. Balls to be used in the Competition shall be provided by the Association. (Remark: All modified racket is not allowed to use during the competition.)
- c. Participants who play in consecutive matches may take a break of 5 to 10 minutes between each match. The Organiser reserves the right to make arrangements according to actual circumstances. Participants shall not request postponement of matches on the grounds of fatigue.
- d. Schools should remind their students to bring along their lunch and sufficient drinks.
- e. In case of a breach of the rules or regulations of the Competition or display of unsporting behaviour by a participant, the referee shall have the right to disqualify the participant from the Competition.
- f. The Organiser will carry out photo shoots/video-filming/arrange broadcasting during the competitions, and has the right to display/publish the event photos or videos on the Internet, at venues of the Leisure and Cultural Services Department, on the dedicated website, in publications of the Organiser and through other publicity channels, for promotion of activities or record purposes.

16. Awards :

- a. Each participant will receive a commemorative certificate.
- b. Certificate and trophy will be awarded to the Champion, first, second, third runners-up and four merit award winners in each division. The champion, first, second and third runners-up in each group will also obtain a prize from individually. The prizes will be presented to the winners on the spot after the finals are completed.
- c. For participants who fail to show up for or complete any event, the Organiser has the right to revoke their eligibility for prizes and no trophies or certificates will be given to them.

17. Other Award

- a. This competition is a scoring event of the **School Sports Programme Award Scheme (Pilot Scheme) – LCSD Cup**.
- b. A total of 16 awards will be presented. Trophies will be awarded at the 2026 School Sports Programme Prize Presentation Ceremony cum Carnival to honour schools with the most outstanding performance between 1 January 2026 and 10 June 2026. The awards include:
LCSD Cup–Primary School Boys’ Division: Champion, 1st Runner-up, 2nd Runner-up and 3rd Runner-up

LCSD Cup–Primary School Girls’ Division: Champion, 1st Runner-up, 2nd Runner-up and 3rd Runner-up

LCSD Cup–Secondary School Boys’ Division: Champion, 1st Runner-up, 2nd Runner-up and 3rd Runner-up

LCSD Cup–Secondary School Girls’ Division: Champion, 1st Runner-up, 2nd Runner-up and 3rd Runner-up

18. Appeal :

No appeal will be accepted. The referees’ decision on the results made on the competition day shall be final. Participants shall raise no objection.

The organizer will not accept video footage submitted by any party as a basis for complaints.
